#### **Hector Duarte**

I am a painter, printmaker, and muralist building upon the Mexican muralist tradition and the community mural movement. I am interested in advancing the art of mural painting and in discovering new solutions and techniques for this art form. Mural painting is an excellent artistic expression for schools, neighborhoods, and communities. Students' interest in other subjects is piqued as they learn to paint; choosing a mural theme requires knowledge of history or current events, and enlarging images to mural proportions or calculating angles of perception is math in practice. Murals add life to the urban landscape, motivate us to appreciate art, and inspire people of all ages.
